THE ORGANISATION:

The Victorian Council of Social Service (VCOSS) is the peak body of the social and community sector in Victoria. VCOSS members reflect the diversity of the sector and include large charities, peak organisations, small community services, advocacy groups, and individuals interested in social policy.

VCOSS works to achieve a Victoria free from poverty and disadvantage, and to achieve wellbeing for all Victorians and their communities.

3. Collaborate with VCOSS members and stakeholders to support strong, place-based community services.
4. Support VCOSS’ work to achieve wellbeing and inclusive growth across the state and other related lobbying, campaigning and advocacy activities. This includes co-ordination of the VCOSS Listening Tour which will engage with local communities.
5. Oversee the production of research and reports that are high-quality, informative and engaging.
6. Identify and pursue opportunities for partnerships and collaborative working arrangements with research and other relevant organisations.
7. Support VCOSS’s work to support and grow VCOSS membership.
8. Represent VCOSS on external committees, at public forums and in meetings with senior representatives of government.
9. Manage staff to work most effectively in pursuit of VCOSS’s Vision and Purpose.
10. Manage budgets to support the organisation’s operations.
